


KU announces its institutional membership agreement with Oracle Academy






KU football team won second place


KU students participated in The Pink Walkathon event which comes within the programs of the Bahrain Cancer Awareness Campaign

Training the Trainers: Workshop for High-Ranking Police Officers in Bahrain





Fellowship is awarded at four levels: Associate Fellow, Fellow, Senior Fellow, and Principal Fellow. Each level is aligned with a different Descriptor of the PSF 2023. The workshop leader then provided an overview of the PSF 2023. The PSF 2023 is a framework that describes the different dimensions of teaching and supporting learning in higher education. It is used by individuals, institutions, and national bodies to support professional development and recognition. The workshop leader then turned to the topic of developing a successful Fellowship application. He explained that the most important thing is to demonstrate that you meet the requirements of the Descriptor at the level you are applying for. He also provided tips on how to structure your application and write evidence statements that are clear, concise, and persuasive. The workshop concluded with a Q&A session. Participants asked a variety of questions about the Fellowship scheme, the PSF 2023, and the application process. Participants provided positive feedback on the workshop. They appreciated the clear and concise explanations of the Fellowship scheme, the PSF 2023, and the application process. They also found the Q&A session to be helpful. Overall, the workshop was a success in preparing new recruits to attain Advance HE Fellowship. Participants left the workshop with a better understanding of the scheme, the PSF 2023, and the application process. They were also equipped with the knowledge and skills they need to develop a successful Fellowship application.


KU and Bahrain Royal Police Academy Collaborate on Trainer of Trainers program


Introduction to AA Visiting School Bahrain activities and workshops

Dr. Suha Hasan delivered a presentation on the activities and workshops of the Architectural Association (AA) Visiting School-Bahrain. The school's focus is on the connection between climate change and heritage, exploring new ways of representation using film. The shifting coastlines throughout history, exacerbated by climate changes, have raised important questions about small island states. Some states, like Tuvalu, have virtually recreated themselves to demand political recognition, preserving and documenting their island ecology. Qal'at al-Bahrain is the chosen site for studying climate change challenges, employing film as a medium to capture the island's ecology. Participants will collaborate in groups to create a 4-7-minute documentary film, incorporating data research, artistic practices, and a rich historical backdrop. These films will explore the critical issue of climate change in relation to archaeology and emphasis the interplay between history and the urgent challenges of climate we face today.
