The team—Sara Mohamed Sharif, Raya Sharfaraz, and Fatima Nazira—worked under the guidance of their advisor, Mrs. Marwa Assem Eifan, to develop a solution connecting emergency rooms, hospitals, and ambulances, aiming to expedite medical responses and save lives.

This victory highlights the high level of innovation and technological proficiency at Kingdom University and underscores the university's commitment to fostering student creativity and excellence. The winning team will now advance to the regional stage, further enhancing Kingdom University's reputation in international technical competitions.

## First Advisory Board Meeting AY2026–2025

## A Visit to Pearling Path Project – Muharraq

To engage students in real world experiences, the College of Engineering and Design visited Pearling Path Project in Muharraq . This was arranged as a co-curricular activity for the course (Urban Design-ARE461) under the supervision of the course's instructor, Dr. Sherif Elwageeh. He coordinated with Architect Fatima Al-Hayki from Bahrain Authority for Culture and Antiquities (BACA) to arrange for the visit. It was essential for students to experience a real example of an urban design project aiming to develop an existing urban context. The visit started in the Pearling Path visitors center with a demonstration by Architect Ghassan Chemali (Urban conservation specialist-BACA). Through the presentation, students were introduced to the background, motivation, and ideas behind the initiation of Pearling Path project. Students visited some of the public urban spaces along the path and were introduced to their design concept and design elements. Moreover, they also visited some of the houses that were subject to restoration and adaptive re-use along the path to showcase the life of famous Bahraini families who were involved in the pearl hunting and to be used as open museums for public.



## A Participation in Final Juries at Gulf University

Arch. Hana participated as a member of the final jury for Design Studio III at Gulf University. The jury evaluated students' projects focused on the renovation of a four-season hotel in Bahrain into a healthcare facility. A total of 17 students presented their design projects, showcasing innovative architectural solutions that addressed functional, technical, and healthcare-related requirements.



## Shura Council Hosts KU to Discuss Research on Multinational Taxation and Foreign Investment



At the request of the Shura Council of Bahrain, KU conducted an official visit to the Council to discuss a research study prepared by a university research team represented by Dr. Abdelrhman Meero, Dr. Naji Mansour (College of Business), and Dr. Nadia Al-Jebali (College of Law). The meeting focused on the study examining the impact of Decree-Law No. (11) regulating multinational enterprise taxation and its implications for foreign direct investment in the Kingdom of Bahrain. The research team presented the study's key findings and discussed its relevance to Bahrain's investment environment and fiscal policy framework. Discussions addressed opportunities to enhance cooperation between the Shura Council and KU, as well as ways to further develop and expand the current study to include additional policy and economic dimensions. The meeting reflects the University's commitment to applied research and constructive engagement with national institutions in support of informed policymaking.



## KU Academic Participates in Cisco MEA & CIS Partner Conference in Dubai on January 13th-15th 2026.

The Cisco MEA & CIS Partner Conference convened industry leaders, technology practitioners, and academic representatives to discuss advancements in digital transformation, cybersecurity, networking, and artificial intelligence (AI) across the Middle East, Africa, and CIS regions. Ms. Lilibeth S. Azuela from the College of Information Technology considered the conference highly pertinent to current academic initiatives. The sessions reinforced the importance of integrating future skillsets, workforce readiness indicators, and digital literacy frameworks into higher education programs to strengthen student learning and employability. Discussions highlighted the increasing relevance of AI-driven automation, secure network infrastructures, and the alignment of academic curricula with global certification standards. These insights hold value for higher education institutions seeking to enhance student employability, technical competencies, and exposure to emerging technologies. On the final day of the conference featured a specialized hands-on workshop focused on AI automation and Cisco Modeling Labs (CML). As digital innovation accelerates globally, forums such as the Cisco Partner Conference underscore the vital role of higher education institutions in developing future-ready talents capable of contributing to knowledge-based and technology-driven economies.



## Dr. Shafiq Ul Rehman, KU, Bahrain as a keynote Speaker online: The Evolving Cybersecurity Landscape and the Pivotal Role of AI in Strengthening Digital Resilience Across Sectors

As cyber threats become more sophisticated, automated, and persistent, traditional cybersecurity approaches are increasingly inadequate for protecting today's highly interconnected digital environments. This talk examines the evolving cybersecurity landscape and underscores the critical shift toward digital resilience, where organizations focus not only on prevention but also on anticipation, rapid recovery, and continuous adaptation. It highlights the pivotal role of artificial intelligence in enabling predictive threat detection, real-time response, and automated defense across sectors such as healthcare, finance, education, critical infrastructure, and government. The session also addresses the dual-use challenge of AI—where attackers and defenders both leverage advanced technologies—and emphasizes the importance of governance, ethics, and trust in responsible AI

deployment. Concluding with a forward-looking perspective on Digital Defense 5.0, the talk positions AI-driven, zero-trust, and autonomous security architectures as essential pillars for strengthening digital resilience in an increasingly complex threat landscape.

KU has achieved a new national achievement when a team of female students at the College of Information Technology won the first place award at the level of the Kingdom of Bahrain in the Huawei ICT Competition – Innovation Track -2025 2026, for their distinguished innovative project «ResQ-AI: Intelligent Emergency Triage & Response System», which is concerned with developing smart solutions for emergency medical response using artificial intelligence technologies.

The winning team included students Sara Mohamed Sharif, Raya Sharfaraz, and Fatima Nazira, under the supervision of academic advisor Mrs. Marwa Assem Eifan were able to present an integrated technical project that focuses on improving the efficiency of dealing with medical emergencies by linking emergency rooms to hospitals, ambulances, and smart systems, which contributes to accelerating the medical response and saving lives.

This victory reflects the advanced level reached by the students of KU in the fields of innovation and technology, and their ability to employ artificial intelligence to address real challenges affecting society and the health sector, within a strong national competition in which teams from various educational institutions participated.

### From Legal Study to Practical Practice

In my career, I am currently working as a lawyer and entrepreneur, and I am the Director of the office of «Al Riyada Corner Advocates and Legal Consultants», in addition to managing and establishing a number of commercial companies in both the Kingdom of Bahrain and the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. My work combines specialized legal practice with direct business action, allowing me to have a comprehensive understanding of market needs and business requirements from both a legal and practical perspective.

The nature of my work is diverse, with legal services including the formation and legal regulation of companies, risk management, protection of projects from regulatory loopholes, and representation of individuals and companies in cases and disputes. I am also keen to provide practical solutions that are based on the actual reality of the business, not from an abstract theoretical proposition.

As for the extent to which my specialization is relevant to my current job, the study of law has formed the fundamental foundation of my career. Legal specialization is not just a litigation tool, but a comprehensive framework for regulating and ensuring business sustainability. The law has enabled me to read contracts consciously, analyze risks before they occur, and build sound legal structures for businesses, which has directly reflected on the success of my work as a lawyer and entrepreneur.

In this context, my study experience at Kingdom University has had a profound impact on the formation of my professional personality. The study has provided me with basic legal knowledge, legal analysis skills, and systematic understanding of texts and legislation. Most importantly, the university has instilled in me the ability to link the academic aspect with practical application, which is what the job market really needs. I still evoke what I learned in the classroom when dealing with cases, drafting contracts, and making business-related legal decisions.

Based on my experience, I would like to advise students and graduates not to be satisfied with theoretical information, but to seek practical application, training, and early involvement in the labor market. Today's market does not measure success by what is preserved, but by what is applied. Building expertise requires patience, experience, and a willingness to take responsibility, along with

constantly developing personal and professional skills.

As for my relationship with Kingdom University as a graduate, it is one of pride and belonging. KU was a key milestone in my educational career, and it contributed to preparing me to transition from the academic stage to professional life with confidence. I am proud to be part of Kingdom University, and I consider myself a graduate who seeks to represent his university honorably in the labor market, and to contribute to conveying a positive image of its educational outcomes.
