Thoughts on Agentic AI

AI is driving major disruptive transformations across all types of higher education institutions. It can build a fully integrated educational experience for faculty and students that is more customized and operates at higher efficiency. This thought affirms the core transformative value of this technology, arguing that it is far more than an ordinary teaching aid; instead, it is a core change catalyst driving the overall iteration of higher education. I think, the real-world implementation of this technology's value can be divided into four core dimensions, each of which directly targets the main points of traditional higher education models, forming a complete logical chain of resolution, solution deployment, and value release.

First, it supports students' personalized learning. To address the common main point that some students struggle to fully grasp complex specialized tasks in their professional fields, Agentic AI can proactively push interactive videos and visual teaching tools that align with these students' pace of comprehension, helping them fill their cognitive gaps and keep up with the pace of group teaching.

Second, it reduces the administrative burden on faculty. To address the faculty who spend their core teaching and research time on repetitive tasks such as grade entry, routine Q&A responses, and sorting teaching materials year after year, Agentic AI can automatically complete these clerical tasks, freeing up time for core teaching, research, and talent development.

Third, it optimizes the full-semester complete learning cycle. To address the main points of delayed learning progress feedback and difficulties in promptly filling knowledge gaps that exist in traditional teaching, Agentic AI can track every student's learning status throughout the entire process, generate accurate weekly reports and share them with faculty and students, smoothing the full teaching workflow from pre-class preview to final assessments.

Last, it empowers all groups to improve their research capabilities. To address the main points that faculty and students now must spend long time organizing literature and preprocessing research data, Agentic AI can automatically map the intellectual context of field-specific literature, flag core research gaps, and complete basic data processing, significantly lowering the threshold for entering academic research. Ultimately, universities that implement Agentic AI will build a personalized, efficient, and innovative educational ecosystem, truly reshape the core nature of teaching and learn in higher education. Are we ready to enter this new era in education?

Landscape Architecture Graduation Jury University of Bahrain 19th May 20

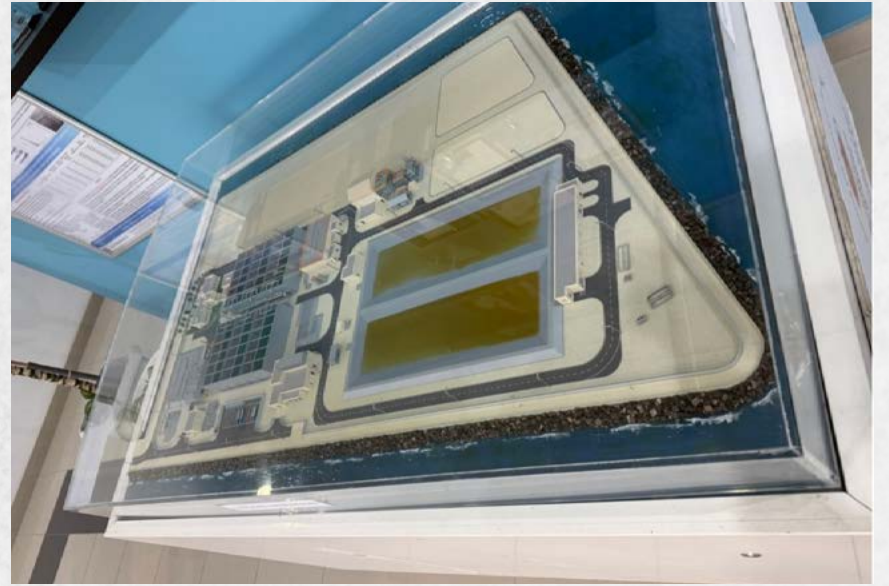
Arch. Maryam Al Bastaki participated as an external juror in the final graduation jury for students in the Landscape Architecture Program at the University of Bahrain. The projects covered a range of themes, including waterfronts, therapeutic parks, sensory gardens, school gardens, and educational gardens. The jury was organized by Ms. Fatema Naheed, the course instructor, with Dr. Omaima Alabbasi serving as the internal juror.



Dr. Nabil Al Baloushi orchestrated an insightful visit to the Hidd wastewater treatment plant, with the invaluable support and supervision of the Ministry of Works. This excursion was a pivotal component of the Biology course, aimed at connecting the theoretical concepts taught in the classroom with the practical applications of wastewater treatment processes in Bahrain. As the students arrived, they were immediately immersed in the world of civil and environmental engineering. They learned how engineers meticulously design and operate essential units within wastewater treatment plants (WWTPs). The visit emphasized the importance of professional safety culture, with students receiving a thorough briefing on personal protective equipment (PPE), access regulations, and emergency procedures before entering the facility. The day's itinerary included a technical presentation that detailed the sewer network and the daily flow patterns of East Hidd. Students discovered the significance of the design peaking factor, set at 1.9, which plays a crucial role in the plant's operations. As they explored the main treatment units, they observed processes such as preliminary treatment, biological reactors, clarifiers, and tertiary treatment, gaining firsthand experience of how wastewater is processed. The sludge line was particularly fascinating, showcasing thickening, drying, and incineration at approximately 850 °C, all while adhering to stringent continuous emissions monitoring (CEMS) standards. Through this visit, the students grasped the essential roles microorganisms play as the "workforce" that removes organic and nutrient pollutants within real WWTP units. They learned that the performance of these processes hinges on key parameters such as flow, dissolved oxygen (DO) control, sludge age, and the consistent monitoring conducted by engineers. This experience underscored the direct connection between wastewater treatment, engineering, microbiology, and public health protection. The partnership between Kingdom University and the Ministry of Works emerged as a vital support system for training the next generation of civil environmental engineers, aligning with Bahrain's Vision 2030 to enhance public health and safeguard the marine environment.

Bahrain TV Commentary:

Professor Saad Darwish on Social Responsibility, Community Partnership, and Civil Defense 2026-4-27



Prof. Saad Darwish's short commentary on Bahrain TV carried a clear message about the meaning of social responsibility and why it matters in everyday , not only in emergency moments, but also in how communities work together each day. He spoke about the need for people and institutions to take an active role in serving society, emphasizing that responsibility grows stronger when it becomes a shared culture rather than an individual effort. At the center of his message was the idea that KU involvement can play a meaningful role in turning goodwill into real partnerships. He highlighted that university engagement should not remain limited to awareness campaigns or isolated activities. Instead, it should connect students, academic expertise, and community initiatives with Bahrain's social actors. When collaboration is built carefully, community programs become more effective, more organized, and more able to respond to real needs. Prof. Darwish HCECE also stressed that collaboration is essential for protecting the welfare of Bahrain society especially during the Iranian Aggression . Social responsibility, in his view, requires cooperation between various groups, public bodies, civil defense , community organizations, and educational institutions , so that efforts do not compete or duplicate one another. Through partnership, support can be better directed toward vulnerable individuals, community challenges can be addressed earlier, and the overall strength of society can increase. A major part of the commentary focused on "responding to protect the Bahrain society," linking social responsibility with civil defense. He framed civil defense not merely as an emergency response system, but as a broader responsibility connected to preparedness, public awareness, and readiness. Protecting society means helping people understand risks, know what to do in urgent situations, and build a calm and disciplined community response. This kind of preparedness can save lives and reduce harm, especially when emergencies happen suddenly. In addition, Prof. Darwish connected the concept of service to national protection. Defending the country, he suggested, is not only about defending borders or handling direct threats. It also includes defending the nation through resilience, public safety, and collective commitment. When citizens participate in community efforts and strengthen civil defense awareness, they contribute to stability and unity. Ultimately, the message was simple but powerful responding to protect Bahrain society through civil defense and community partnership is a shared national duty, one that turns care into protection and awareness into action.

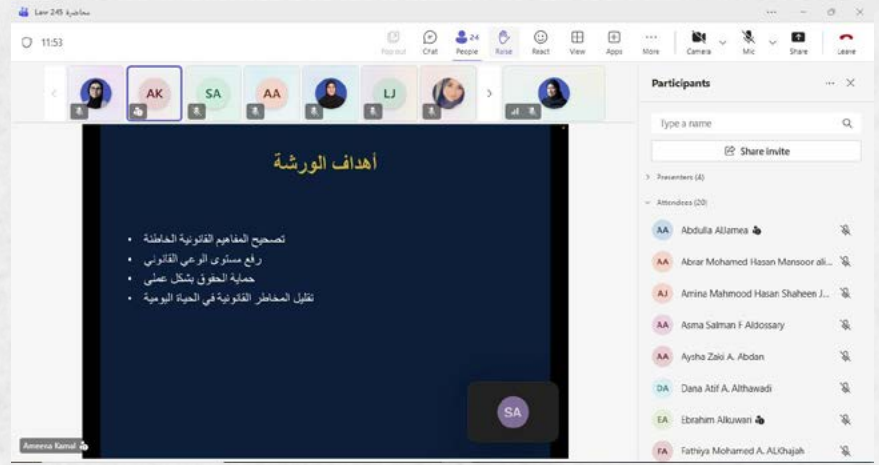
A Workshop Entitled «Law in Our Everyday Lives»
